





Transportation

From Taoyuan International Airport (TPE)

- **Taoyuan Airport MRT:** The Taoyuan Airport MRT connects with Taipei Metro system at Taipei Main Station. Guests can transfer to the Tamsui-Xinyi Line (Taipei Metro) and get off at Taipei 101 / World Trade Center Station – Exit 5.
- **Airport Bus:** Air Bus 1960 offers a transit service between the airport and Grand Hyatt Taipei daily.
 - Taoyuan Airport Terminal 1 bus pickup point: Bus pickup zone at B1 arrivals lobby.
 - Taoyuan Airport Terminal 2 bus pickup point: Bus pickup zone at the outdoor gallery at east side of 1F arrivals lobby.

From Taipei Songshan Airport

- Take the Taipei Metro **Wenhu Line (Brown)** at Songshan Airport Station to Daan Station, transfer to the Tamsui-Xinyi Line (Red) to Taipei 101/World Trade Center Station.





Where Artifacts Meet Landscapes: Exploring Northern Taiwan' s Rich Heritage

Date: 12th September 2025

Bàoshí, a short yet scenic trail once used as a coastal lookout, now offering stunning views of the Yin-Yang Sea and surrounding peaks. Continue to the Gold Museum, Taiwan' s first eco-museum, preserving Jinguashi' s rich mining legacy. Enjoy lunch at the Grand Hotel' s Kunlun Room, followed by a walk through its Western Secret Passage. The day concludes with a visit to the National Palace Museum, a must-see for international visitors and home to one of the world' s finest collections of Chinese imperial artifacts. This thoughtfully curated journey offers a graceful glimpse into the cultural soul of Taiwan.

Jinguashi Baoshi Mountain Trill



Located in Ruifang District, New Taipei City, Mt. Baoshi (also known as Mt. Shuǐluó) stands at 260 meters. Once home to a wartime alarm system, it now features one of Taiwan' s shortest scenic trails. A 10-minute walk leads to a viewing platform overlooking the Yin-Yang Sea, with stunning 360° views of Jiufen, Jinguashi, and surrounding peaks.

Jinguashi Gold Mine Museum

Gold Mine Museum blends the rich heritage of gold mining with the serene beauty of Jinguashi' s misty mountains. As Taiwan' s first eco-museum, it weaves together historic mining trails, relics, and hillside architecture to tell the story of a once-thriving community—where nature, memory, and industry quietly coexist.



National Palace Museum



Home to one of the world' s finest collections of Chinese imperial artifacts, the National Palace Museum offers a breathtaking journey through over 8,000 years of history. From jade carvings to ancient calligraphy, each piece tells a story of dynasties past and cultural treasures preserved.

Travel to Taipei

Practical Information

■ Climate

Northern Taiwan has a subtropical climate. Daytime temperatures in Taipei in September typically reach around 31°C (88°F), with evening temperatures dropping to approximately 26°C (79°F).

Participants are advised to bring light, breathable clothing and an umbrella or raincoat, as short afternoon showers are common during this month.

■ Currency

The official currency of Taiwan is the New Taiwan Dollar (NTD), available in the following denominations:

Coins: \$1, \$5, \$10, \$50

Notes: \$100, \$200, \$500, \$1000

Almost all vendors in Taipei accept cash. Most shops, hotels and restaurants also accept major credit cards (Visa, Mastercard, JCB, UnionPay), but not traveler' s cheques. As of May 2025, the exchange rates are approximately USD 1 to NTD 30 and EUR 1 to NTD 34. Be sure to check out the latest rates.

Banks operate on Monday to Friday (except public holidays) from 09:30 to 15:30. You may exchange currency at airports, banks and post offices; but don' t forget to bring your passport with you. You can also use your domestic credit or debit card to withdraw NTD from ATMs across Taiwan. Check with your card issuers in advance.

■ Language

The official language in Taiwan is Mandarin. While English is widely spoken and the Taiwanese are known for their friendliness, it is generally easy to ask for help or clarify directions. Most signs for destinations and on public transportation are also in English.

We recommend carrying Mandarin translations of the places you plan to visit, as well as a hotel address card to show to taxi drivers, who may have limited English proficiency.

■ Smoking Policy

Smoking is prohibited in all indoor, most public places, the Mass Rapid Transit (MRT) stations, and bus stops. Please pay attention to non-smoking signs.

■ Electricity & Plug

Electric current of 110 volts at 60 cycles is used.

Participants from Europe, Australia or South-East Asia will need an adaptor or transformer

■ Time Difference

Taipei is 8 hours ahead of GMT.

Public Transportation

■ Getting from/to the Airports

There are two international airports serving Taipei:

Taoyuan International Airport (TPE)

- The most convenient airport for traveling to Taipei.
- Offers regular scheduled flights from major international airlines.
- Located approximately 50 kilometers from Grand Hyatt Taipei and Taipei 101.
- Recommended: Taxi or airport shuttle for the most direct and seamless way to reach Xinyi District.

Taipei Songshan Airport

- Primarily serves destinations in Taiwan and other locations in Asia (e.g., Seoul, Tokyo, mainland China).
- Located less than 20 minutes by car to Grand Hyatt Taipei and Taipei 101.
- More conveniently located than Taoyuan Airport.

■ Public Transportation in Taipei

TAXI

- In Taiwan, taxis are yellow and widely available at taxi ranks, hotels, and airports.
- Taxis can also be hailed on the streets of Taipei City.
- Uber is available as well.
- Estimated fares:
 - Taoyuan Airport → Taipei City: ~NT\$1,200
 - Songshan Airport → Taipei City: ~NT\$500

BUS

- Taipei buses **cover the entire city** and are a great way to explore in depth.
- Fares:
 - Payable in **coins** or using the **EasyCard** (electronic travel card)
 - One trip costs **NT\$15**
- When using the EasyCard:
 - Tap the card **when boarding and alighting**
 - Fare will be deducted accordingly

METRO (MRT)

- Often the **fastest and most convenient** mode of transport in Taipei
- Train frequency: Every **3 to 5 minutes**
- Average travel time between stations: **~2 minutes**
- **Not allowed inside the metro:** Smoking, eating, drinking, chewing gum
- Ticketing:
 - One-way tickets from vending machines
 - Day passes and **EasyCard** available at MRT information desks
